CLICKBAIT Ads pop up on many websites that we visit. Clicking on these pop-ups may lead to impulsepurchasing, computer viruses, unwanted sharing of private information, or pathways to inappropriate web pages. How can we avoid falling into the traps of clickbait? Surf the web for a while and collect information on all of the advertisements, email requests, and "Congratulations, you're a winner" announcements that pop up on your pages. What kinds of products and services are advertised? What techniques do the advertisers use with these pop-ups? Consider colors, sounds, animation, flashing, screen position, images, fonts and persuasive techniques explained on p. 29 in this book. How might some of these techniques intimidate or force people to click on them? What are some strategies you could use and share with others to help everyone avoid being tricked or bullied into falling for clickbait?
